

ANTI-BOMB SQUAD FOUND TOY RIFLES AND A TOY GUN

Multiple blasts at mosque in Indonesia's Jakarta, injure 55

JAKARTA: Multiple explosions shook a mosque at a high school during Friday prayers in Jakarta, Indonesia's capital, injuring at least 55 people, mostly students. Police tried to dissuade speculation that the blasts were a terror attack and said they were investigating.

Witnesses told local television stations that they heard at least two loud blasts around midday, from inside and outside the mosque, just as the sermon had started at the mosque at SMA 27, a state high school within a navy compound in Jakarta's northern Kelapa Gading neighbourhood.

Students and others ran out in panic as gray smoke filled the mosque.

Most of the victims suffered minor to severe injuries from glass shards and burns. The cause of the explosions was not immediately known but they came from near the mosque's loudspeaker, according to Jakarta Police Chief Asep Edi Suheri.

The injured were rushed to nearby hospitals, from where some were sent home after initial treatment but 20 students remained hospitalised for burns, three of them with

serious injuries, the police chief said.

Videos circulating in social

media showed dozens of students in school uniform running in panic across the school's basketball court, some covering their ears with their hands, apparently to protect themselves from the loud blasts.

Shocked relatives of the students gathered at centres set up at Yarsi and Cempaka Putih hospitals to seek information about loved ones.

Parents told television stations their children had wounds from being hit in the head, feet and hands by sharp nails and pieces of exploding objects.

Suheri, the police chief, said an anti-bomb squad that was deployed at the scene found toy rifles and a toy gun near the mosque.

"Police are still investigating the scene to determine the cause," he said and urged against speculation that the incident was an attack before police investigation is completed. "Let the authorities work first," Suheri said. "We will convey whatever the results are to the public." Indonesia, the world's most populous Muslim-majority country, was struck by a major militant attack in 2002 when al-Qaida staged bombings on the resort island of Bali that killed 202 people, mostly foreign tourists.

In subsequent years, there have been mostly smaller, less deadly strikes that have targeted foreigners, the government, police and anti-terrorism forces, as well as those considered infidels by militant groups.

In December 2022, a Muslim militant and convicted bomb-maker who was released from prison the previous year, blew himself up at a police station in West Java, killing an officer and wounding 11 people.

World leaders gather for 2nd day in Brazil, seek solutions to confront global warming

BELEM: As world leaders head to a second day of climate talks being hosted in Brazil, a major proposal to protect tropical forests worldwide is sure to be a major topic of discussion.

Brazil's President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva on Thursday sought to mobilise funding to halt the ongoing destruction of tropical rainforests and advance the many unmet promises made at previous summits.

He's proposing a fund called the Tropical Forests Forever Facility that would pay 74 developing countries to keep their trees standing, using loans from wealthier nations and commercial investors. Financed by interest-bearing debt instead of donations, it aims to make it more lucrative for governments to keep their trees rather than cut them

down. The location where the proposal was announced and the talks are being held, Belem, is significant because the city is part of the Amazon rainforest, which is crucial in helping to regulate the climate.

Destroying rainforests makes money for cattle ranchers, miners and illegal loggers, but Brazil hopes to convince countries that preserving forests promises richer rewards for the entire world by absorbing huge amounts of carbon

dioxide, a greenhouse gas that heats the planet when it's released into the atmosphere.

As senior Brazilian officials walked reporters through the fund's inner workings, Norway pledged USD3 billion — the biggest commitment of the day — raising hopes for Lula's ambitions to become a reality.

UN votes on resolution to remove Syrian Prez from sanctions list

UNITED NATIONS: The UN Security Council has voted on a US-backed resolution to remove Syrian President Bashar al-Assad from the 1267 ISIL (Daesh) and Al-Qaida sanctions list, a move described by Council members as a "strong political sig-

nal" of recognising a "new era" in the war-torn country. The 15-nation Council voted Thursday on the resolution that decided to "delist" al-Sharara and Interior Minister Anas Hasan Khattab from the ISIL and Al-Qaida Sanctions List.

Trump admin seeks to halt SNAP payments after court order

BOSTON: President Donald Trump's administration asked a federal appeals court Friday to block a judge's order that it distribute November's full monthly SNAP benefits amid a US government shutdown, even as at least some states said they were moving quickly to get the money to people.

US District Judge John J. McConnell Jr. had given Trump's administration until Friday to make the payments through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program. But Trump's administration asked the appeals court to suspend any court orders requiring it to spend more money than is available in a continuing fund.

The court filing came even as Wisconsin Gov. Tony Evers' spokesperson Britt Cudaback said on Friday that some SNAP recipients in the state already had received their full November payments overnight on Thursday.

"We've received confirmation that payments went through, including members reporting they can now see their balances," she said.

The court wrangling prolonged weeks of uncertainty for the food program that serves about 1 in 8 Americans, mostly with lower incomes.

Last week's rulings ordered the government to use one

emergency reserve fund containing USD 4.6 billion to pay for SNAP for November but gave it leeway to tap other money to make the full payments, which cost between USD 8.5 billion and USD 9 billion each month.

On Monday, the administration said it would not use additional money, saying it was up to Congress to appropriate the funds for the programme.

The next day, Trump appeared to threaten not to pay the benefits at all unless Democrats in Congress agreed to reopen the government.

His press secretary later said that partial benefits were being paid for November -- and that it is future payments that are at risk if the shutdown continues.

Late Wednesday, the USDA, which runs the programme, said in a filing in the federal court in Rhode Island that it had done further analysis and found that the maximum benefit will be 65 per cent of the usual amount.

BANGLADESH POLLS

BNP accuses interim govt of creating situation that could disrupt elections

DHAKA: Former prime minister Khaleda Zia's Bangladesh Nationalist Party on Friday accused Muhammad Yunus-led interim government of creating a situation that could disrupt the general elections.

Addressing a party rally in the national capital, BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir also said that the people of Bangladesh will not accept anything other than holding the election and the referendum on the July Charter on the same day in February next year.

"It is unfortunate for us that the interim government, which we fully supported, is now creating a situation that could disrupt the national election," he said.

The issue centred around a proposed referendum on the "July Charter" drafted by the Yunus-led National Consensus Commission after consultations with several parties, barring deposed prime minis-



ter Sheikh Hasina's Awami League and its allies.

Despite initial reluctance, the BNP agreed to the referendum, but suggested doing it simultaneously with the elections. However, Jamaat and a few other Islamist parties are demanding that the referendum be held before the polls.

Law Adviser Asif Nazrul on Monday asked all political parties to reach a consensus within a week on the referendum on the July Charter, saying the government would take a unilateral decision if they failed to

reach an agreement. "What was the point of all the work done by the Consensus Commission so far?" Alamgir said.

He also warned the interim government against any attempt to delay the elections.

"Let me say this very clearly - there are conspiracies surrounding the election. The election and the referendum must be held on the same day, and that election must take place in February 2026. Otherwise, the people of Bangladesh will never accept it," Alamgir said.

On Thursday, Jamaat-e-Islami's General Secretary Syed Abdullah Mohammad Tahir said that the referendum must be held ahead of the election.

"Fingers will be bent if necessary to achieve our demands," he said, without naming anyone, though Jamaat last week asked BNP for talks on their differences.

'Tehran faces water rationing and evacuations if it doesn't rain soon'

TEHRAN: Iran's president has warned that the capital is facing an unprecedented water and energy crisis as reservoirs have plunged to historic lows, threatening supplies of drinking water and electricity generation, it was reported on Friday.

"If it doesn't rain in Tehran by late November, we'll have to ration water. And if it still doesn't rain, we'll have to evacuate Tehran," President Masoud Pezeshkian was cited as saying on Thursday by the SNN.ir semi-official news agency.

Pezeshkian described the situation as "extremely critical," citing reports that Tehran's dam reservoirs have fallen to their lowest level in 60 years.

The city has entered its sixth consecutive year of drought, with some dams at less than 10 per cent of capacity.

Officials say that in the east of Tehran, the Layan Dam — one of five key reservoirs — is only about 9 per cent full.

"Layan's water storage is just nine million cubic metres," Deputy Energy Minister Mohammad Javanbakht said recently, calling the situation "critical."

Tehran, a sprawling city of about 9.1 million residents located within a province of roughly 14.5 million people, relies heavily on hydropower. But as rivers and wetlands have dried up, power output has plummeted, forcing some plants offline for lack of cooling water. Officials have described the water shortage as "unprecedented."

Iran's energy system remains highly dependent on hydropower and fossil fuels, while solar and wind together make up only a small share of total capacity.

China commissions third Aircraft Carrier

It is Beijing's most advanced warship equipped with Electromagnetic Catapults

BEIJING: China has commissioned its third aircraft carrier, the Fujian, stated to be the most modern warship equipped with electromagnetic catapults, at a ceremony attended by Chinese President Xi Jinping, wrapped in secrecy.

While the official media reported its commissioning on Friday, a report by state-run Xinhua news agency said that Xi attended the commissioning and flag-presentation ceremony of the Fujian on Wednesday at Sanya port in



south China's Hainan Province.

The Fujian is equipped with an Electromagnetic Aircraft Launch System (EMALS), used only by the American aircraft

carrier USS Gerald R. Ford.

US President Donald Trump last week said he wanted to abandon EMALS technology and go back to steam power,

calling the advanced launch system expensive, unreliable and difficult to repair, the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post reported. While all three Chinese carriers are conventionally powered, recent reports said China is reportedly building its fourth aircraft carrier in Dalian, which could be powered by nuclear propulsion to increase its endurance and global reach and provide significantly more power to run advanced systems.

Pelosi's exit opens way for tough fight to replace her in San Francisco

LOS ANGELES: Former House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's decision to step aside after nearly four decades in Congress kicks off a wide-open contest to replace her at a time when her home city of San Francisco is roiled in debate about the cost of living and what its future should look like.

Pelosi announced Thursday that she will not seek reelection next year, bookending a career that saw her become the first woman in the speaker's chair and one of the most powerful Democrats of her era in Washington.

The race to replace her is unfolding at a time when her deeply Democratic and famously liberal district — which encompasses virtually all of San Francisco — is contending with soaring housing costs and conflict over whether denser development

is the answer to them. Republicans account for a mere 7% of voters.

Not surprisingly, the website for Democratic candidate and former tech executive Saikat Chakrabarti is headlined, "We can fix this."

"The median home in our city now costs \$1.4 million — far more than any middle-class family can afford," he says. San Francisco-based Democratic consultant Eric Jaye says that for voters, "Affordability is at the top of the list" in the city of 830,000 people.

There's an ongoing debate for older residents and new alike — and a lot of anxiety — over "what are we going to be in the future?" Jaye says. With an influx of artificial intelligence and other tech workers and streams of global capital flowing in, "Who is going to get to stay?"

World Briefs

BELGIUM: DRONE SIGHTINGS HALT FLIGHTS AT MAJOR EUROPEAN AIRPORT

BRUSSELS: Flights out of one of Europe's biggest cargo airports were briefly suspended after drones were spotted, an airport official said Friday, an incident that comes amid a spate of incidents around Belgium in recent weeks. Christian Delcourt, the head of communications for Liege airport, said drones forced a sequence of flight interruptions between 9 pm Thursday and 1 am Friday, and again between 7 am and 8 am on Friday, when full operations resumed.

TANZANIA CHARGES DOZENS WITH TREASON OVER VIOLENCE LINKED TO ELECTION

DOLOMA: Prosecutors in Tanzania on Friday charged dozens of people with treason over their alleged roles in violence surrounding the country's disputed election. The charge sheet identified 76 suspects accused of intending to obstruct the October 29 election "for the purpose of intimidating" the authorities in Dar es Salaam, the commercial capital. In addition to treason, the suspects also face criminal conspiracy charges. Tanzania is reeling from violence following an election.
